☐ Alabama's Botanical Relationships

April 21, 2018 – Auburn University Donald E. Davis Arboretum

Takes place at the Donald E. Davis Arboretum on the campus of Auburn University. We will discuss Alabama's plant species, how they are related to each other and their diverse habitats, and their ecological relationships with other Alabama species in both the built and natural environment. We will also cover identification, management, and ecological impacts of Alabama's invasive plants.

☐ Alabama's Wonderful Wildlife

June 9, 2018 – Alabama Wildlife Center in Pelham, Alabama

Taking place at the Alabama Wildlife Center in Pelham Alabama, Participants will get a hands-on look at different wildlife that calls Alabama home.

☐ Agricultural Advocates: Farming as Teaching

June 18-20, 2018 – McDowell Environmental Center

This workshop takes place at the McDowell Farm School at Camp McDowell in Nauvoo Alabama. Learn more about how important farming is to Alabama. Enjoy harvesting food straight from the earth and prepping a farm-to-table meal.

☐ Exploring Living River's Streams

July 13-15, 2018 – Cahaba Environmental Center

Be inspired to connect your students with nature while visiting the Cahaba River. The Cahaba River is the longest undammed river in Alabama and has been named one of the top five rivers in the world for biodiversity by World Wildlife Fund & the Sierra Club. You will explore the Cahaba and the surrounding watershed while learning experiential activities that you can take back to your classroom.

☐ Arts & the Environment

July 23-25, 2018 – Cheaha State Park

This workshop takes place atop Alabama's highest mountain where we explore the natural wonder of Alabama's Cheaha State Park, by hiking and experiencing hands-on art which includes pottery, "found & natural art" techniques, watercolor, nature journaling, longleaf baskets, and more.

☐ Workshop @ Anniston Museum of Natural History

June 14, 2018 – Anniston Museum of Natural History

Taking place at the Anniston Museum of Natural History we will examine various habitats from around the world and the animal adaptations necessary for those habitats. Experience the Bird of Prey Trail and their specific habitat enclosures. We will also walk through the Longleaf Botanical Gardens and learn to identify native tree species.
